Every child under the age of 12 who finds a rock can redeem it at the office of Garrett County Community Action at 104 East Center St. in Oakland for a free book.

Four specially painted rocks with the Community Action logo or the Head Start logo are

eligible to receive special prizes, such as movie tickets, a gift card to Funland, a Walmart gift card, and a summer fun basket.
